



Proposition 4

Proposition 4 is essential for providing safe drinking water, preventing wastewater spills, and complying with state and federal regulations.

Key points:

- Aging infrastructure: Many portions of Petersburg's water and wastewater systems are at the end of their service life and need repairs or replacement.
- Phased debt approach: The debt will not be incurred all at once; each project will require separate Assembly approval.
- Rate adjustments: If projects are delayed, planned rate increases may be adjusted
- Financial strain: Petersburg's small customer base means that the cost of these projects can be significant to each customer.
- **Grant seeking**: The borough will actively seek grants to reduce the necessary debt.
- Rate study: A new rate study will determine the additional revenue needed to cover debt service. A proposed rate structure has not been developed at this time.

<u> Water Department projects seeking debt authorization:</u>

- Scow Bay Haulout and Washdown: \$100,000
- Extend an 8-inch water main to the washdown pad.
- Partial funding from the Congressional Delegation.
- No impact on water rates if use of Economic Development Fund is approved for debt
- Rasmus Enge Bridge Water Main Loop: \$575,000
- Replace a dead-ended, ductile iron water main on the beach under the bridge.
- Use newer, insulated, corrosion-resistant materials.
- Relocate the main to open up improved water service possibilities.
- Extend the main to connect with existing mains, creating a loop and improving service.
- Distribution System Replacements: \$1,320,000
- Replace existing and failing asbestos cement water mains in Lake, Aaslaug, Valkyrie, and Fram Streets.
- Install high-density polyethylene (HDPE) water mains.
- Address the risk of water main blowouts.

INFORMATION PROVIDED BY THE PETERSBURG BOROUGH

Hammer Slough Water Main Replacement: \$480,000

- Replace an asbestos cement water main that crosses Hammer Slough.
- Install a new HDPE water main with adequate bury depth and protection.
- Address the risk of cross-connections and health hazards.
- Cabin Creek Low Level Outlets: \$350.000
- Repair and replace corroded low-level outlets pipes at Cabin Creek Dam.
- Prevent potential failure and ensure safe operation of the dam.

Sandy Beach Water Main Replacement: \$3,300,000

- Replace corroded ductile iron pipe with HDPE
- Disturb as little asphalt as possible.
- Mitigate future water main failures.

Wastewater Department projects seeking debt authorization:

- Pump Station 3 Replacement: \$1,000,000
- Replace outdated and inefficient pumps at Pump Station 3.
- Improve reliability and efficiency of wastewater pumping.
- Reduce the risk of service interruptions and backflow.

Scow Bay Waterfront Pre-Treatment: \$3,200,000

- Install a washdown pad collection system, industrial pre-treatment system, lift station, and electrical connections for the Scow Bay haulout and washdown pad.
- Partial funding from the Congressional Delegation.
- No impact on wastewater rates if use of Economic Development Fund is approved for debt service.

WWTP Lab Upgrades: \$300,000

- Upgrade the wastewater treatment plant lab to meet increased testing requirements.
- Improve efficiency and capacity of lab operations.

Collection System Upgrades: \$1,080,000

- Replace aging asbestos cement and PVC pipes in the wastewater collection system.
- Improve the reliability and safety of the sewer system

Skylark Pump Station Replacement: \$575,000

- Replace the pumps at Skylark pump station to handle increased flow and improve
- Reduce the risk of wastewater backups and service interruptions.

Lumber Street Pump Station Upgrades: \$350,000

- Replace the steel wet wells at three small pump stations.
- Prevent leaks and raw wastewater releases into local sloughs.

WTP Effluent Disinfection: \$10,300,000

- Install a disinfection system to meet new federal and state discharge permit requirements
- Reduce the amount of fecal coliform and enterococcus bacteria released into Frederick
- Significant cost and large impact on wastewater rates.
